

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🛊 Organizing Body and History 🛊

THE TOKYO INTERNATIONAL CONDUCTING COMPETITION is organized by the Min-On Concert Association. It was originally begun in 1967 as "The Min-On Competition" and renamed as "The Tokyo International Music Competition" in 1988. This time, to mark the 20th year of the competition, it is once again being renamed, as "THE TOKYO INTERNATIONAL CONDUCTING COMPETITION."

🛊 Organization Structure 🛊

The organization structure comprises an Organizing Committee, an Executive Committee, a Panel of Judges, and the Competition Office.

The Panel of Judges is proposed by the Executive Committee and formed with the approval of Min-On. The Competition Office has been set up within the Min-On Culture Center in Tokyo.

Eligibility Requirements 1

- •The competition is open to people of all nationalities.
- · Applicants must be 38 years of age or younger at the time of the competition's final round.
- ·Former 1st Prize winners of this competition are not eligible to compete again.

■ Online Application (recommended)

- ·Complete and upload the application form found on the website of Tokyo International Conducting Competition (https://www.conductingtokyo.org/) along with the following three items.
- Upload a recorded video to the Internet and enter its URL in the designated field on the application form.
- 2. A photograph of yourself taken within the last 6 months.
- 3. A legal document that proves your date of birth.
- ·Providing false information or submitting false documentation will result in disqualification.

- ·The contents entered in the form will be encrypted by SSL (Secure Sockets Layer) and TLS (Transport Layer Security) before transmission.

- 2. Three black-and-white or color photographs (5cm×5cm) of yourself taken within the last 6 months. One of these must be attached to the application form.


Provide details of your CV (academic background, the teachers you received instruction from, your musical career, competitions you have participated in, etc.) within the space provided on the digital or regular application form.

2. Pieces of Choice to be Performed in the Final Round (three pieces)

- ·Please refer to the section "Program. Pieces of Choice" on page 15.
- •Please submit three pieces of your choice that you would like to conduct in the final round, mentioned in the form in the order of preference. These pieces must be symphonies or orchestral works with standard triple winds and no more than six players for percussion. They must not contain instrumental or vocal solos, or choruses.
- ·The pieces submitted must not overlap with the assigned pieces specified for any of the rounds.
- ·For each of the pieces, state both the original and the English titles (Japanese title for Japanese applicants), the name of the composer, the opus number, and the edition.

3. Video Footage

- ·Piece to be filmed:
- J. Brahms: Variations on a Theme by Haydn, Op. 56a/b, Variation VII Finale
- •The video must contain footage of the applicant conducting, with both the conductor and the performers filmed in the same frame (ideally, the video would be filmed from behind the performers to show a frontal view of the conductor; please refer to the illustration below).
- ·Careful attention must be paid to microphone position to ensure proper recording of the sound.
- If applying online, the recorded video must be uploaded to the Internet, and the URL must be entered in the application form. If using a video sharing website, please do not set it to a "public" setting that makes it accessible to everyone. Acceptable file formats are MPEG-2, MOV, AVI, MP4, and AVCHD. Videos sent via email or other media are not accepted.
- ·If applying by post, please send the video on a mini-digital video (mini-DV) tape, a DVCAM tape, a DVD, USB flash drive, or SD memory card (VCDs are unacceptable).
- •Please state the recording date in the designated field on the application form. Note that the video must have been recorded after January 1, 2019.
- ·The formation may be either a symphony orchestra, a chamber orchestra, an ensemble, or two or more pianos.
- ·Min-On guarantees that the video material shall be used for no other purpose than the initial screening of documents and video footage.
- ·It is the applicant's responsibility to obtain prior copyright, portrayal right, and other permissions as necessary.
- ·Please note that the submitted video will not be returned.



Selection Based on Documents and Video Footage: Application Period

Applications must be submitted between 00:00 hours on Monday, February 5, 2024, and 23:59 hours, Thursday, May 9, 2024, Japan time.

- *If submitting the application in person, please do so between 10:00 and 17:00 hours on weekdays excluding Japanese national holidays.
- *Applications by post must reach the Competition Office by May 9 (Thursday) to be valid.

🛊 Judging Guidelines 🛊

The orchestra conducting performance of contestants will be judged over the course of three rounds of the competition – the first preliminary round, the second preliminary round, and the final round. The order of appearance in each of the rounds will be determined by lots drawn by the contestants themselves. Please note that all the days of the competition will be open to the public (admission tickets required).

🕆 Participation Fees 🛊

Applicants selected for participation in the first preliminary round based on the submitted documents and video footage are required to pay a participation fee of 50,000 yen (cash, JPY only) at the time of contestant registration before the first preliminary round (see section titled "Contestant Registration" on page 15 and 16).

•The Executive Committee will decide on the piece to be conducted by a contestant from among the three pieces of choice submitted by the contestant at the time of application, and notify their decision after the second preliminary round to contestants who qualify for the final round.

*Notes on formation:

- 1. The pieces must be symphonies or orchestral works with standard triple winds and no more than six players for percussion (including timpani). They must not contain instrumental or vocal solos, or choruses.
- 2. Up to one saxophone is possible.
- 3. Up to one each of piano, celesta, and organ (with up to two players) are possible. Cembalos are not possible.
- 4. Up to two harps are possible.

🛊 Contestant Registration 🛊

All contestants participating in the preliminary or final rounds must assemble for contestant registration at the time and place indicated below to complete the required formalities.

1. First Preliminary Round (contestants selected on the basis of documents and video footage)

Please assemble on the first floor of the Min-On Culture Center at 3:00 p.m. on Sunday, October 6, 2024, for the following:

- announcement of the passages from the assigned piece to be conducted in the first preliminary round
- ·lottery for determining the competition date and order of appearance for the first preliminary round, and announcement of the results
- ·payment of the participation fee
- receipt of subsidy to cover the cost of international airfare for overseas contestants

2. Second Preliminary Round (contestants who have passed the first preliminary round)

The results will be announced at the Awards Presentation Ceremony following the final round on Sunday, October 13.

Awards Presentation Ceremony

The Awards Presentation Ceremony will be held in the competition hall following the final round. All finalists must attend this ceremony.

‡ Awards **‡**

1st, 2nd, and 3rd prizes will be awarded to winning contestants, and finalists who do not win any of the prizes will receive honorable mentions.

If any of the prizes is awarded to two or more contestants, each winner will receive the prize and the full cash award.

If no finalist is considered deserving of a particular prize, then that prize shall not be awarded.

■ The prizes and cash awards are as follows

1 st Prize:Certificate, medal, and cash award of 2,000,000 yen 2nd Prize:Certificate, medal, and cash award of 1,000,000 yen 3rd Prize:Certificate, medal, and cash award of 500,000 yen

■ Special Award (the Hideo Saito Award)

A special award (the Hideo Saito Award) is presented to a finalist selected by the Panel of Judges. It could also happen that no one is selected to receive this award.

Hideo Saito (1902-1974) was a great conductor, cellist, and educator who trained many internationally acclaimed musicians including Seiji Ozawa. He also served as the chairperson of the first Panel of Judges of the Min-On Tokyo International Music Competition for Conducting. The Hideo Saito Award was established to honor and commemorate the great maestro's numerous accomplishments and contribution to this competition from its early days, and to nurture capable musicians who can follow in his footsteps. The award (including a cash award of 500,000 yen) is funded by donations from Hideo Saito's family.

■ Encouragement Award ■

An encouragement award, which includes a cash award of 150,000 yen, shall be given to each finalist receiving an honorable mention (excluding 1st, 2nd, or 3rd prize winners).

■ Audience Award ■

The Audience Award, which includes a cash award of 100,000 yen, will be selected from among the finalists by a vote of the audience.

‡ Press Interviews ‡

All the winners are required to attend the press conference as scheduled below:

Prize Winners

In order to introduce the winners to the largest possible audience, debut concerts will be held on the following dates. All winners are required to perform at these concerts, for which they will be paid performance fees and the specified amount toward travel and accommodation expenses.

↑ Travel and Accommodation Expenses ↑

Overseas contestants (including Japanese nationals living abroad) who participate in the first preliminary round will be provided the following subsidies:

- •an international airfare subsidy, to be paid at the time of registration for the first preliminary round as follows: 50,000 yen/contestant for contestants coming from Asia
- 100,000 yen/contestant for contestants coming from other regions
- ·hotel accommodation, to be provided for all contestants during the period of the competition
- (3:00 p.m. on October 6 to 11:00 a.m. on October 15, 2024); please note that accommodation expenses will not be paid for hotels other than those designated by the Competition Office.

∜ Visas ‡

Contestants are responsible for obtaining their own visas (if required) to enter Japan.

If necessary, please apply to the Competition Office for an invitation letter to help procure the visa.

Rights with Regard to the Competition

- •Contestants must obtain prior permission from the Competition Office before agreeing to any filming, photography, or interviews with a third party. Moreover, contestants must attend and cooperate with any filming, photography, and/or interviews specified by the Competition Office.
- ·Min-On shall have the following rights over the contestants (throughout the competition period, at the press interviews following the competition, and at Debut Concerts and Supplementary Awards):
- 1. the right to record, film, and photograph
- 2. the right to broadcast the recorded, filmed, or photographed materials on radio, television, or the Internet
- 3. the right to reproduce and/or sell the aforementioned materials

The contestants may not raise objections to or make financial claims regarding these rights.

Insurance and Liability

- ·Neither Min-On nor the Executive Committee shall be held liable for
- 1. any loss of or damage to contestants' baggage, or injury to contestants themselves.
- any real or implied physical, material, or mental damage caused to or by contestants during the competition period.
- ·It is highly recommended that contestants make their own insurance arrangements

Objections to the Management, Selection, and Judging Procedures

•Decisions as to the management of this competition, the screening of documents and video footage materials by the Executive Committee, and judgment of contestants' performances by the Panel of Judges shall be final.

·No objections from the contestants shall be entertained.

Addition, Deletion, or Amendment of Provisions

- ·To ensure the smooth management of the competition, the Executive Committee reserves the right to add to, delete, or amend the provisions of these regulations even after their announcement.
- ·Should any problems arise with regard to matters not addressed in these regulations, contestants shall comply with the decisions made by the Executive Committee.

↑ Legal Arbitration ↑

Any legal suits arising due to this competition shall be decided in a Japanese court under Japanese law.

Original Text of the Regulations 🛊

These regulations shall be issued in Japanese, English, and French, and the Japanese version shall be held to be the original text.
